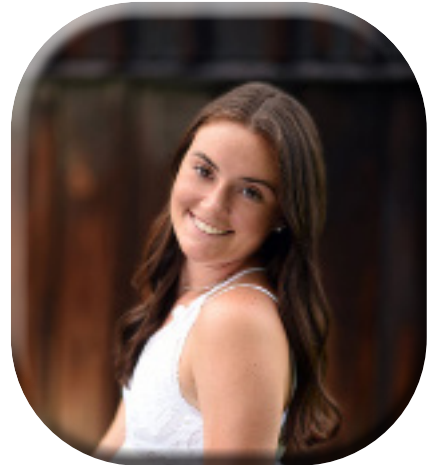

Baseball – Section III “Class B” Champions, NYS Regional Champions

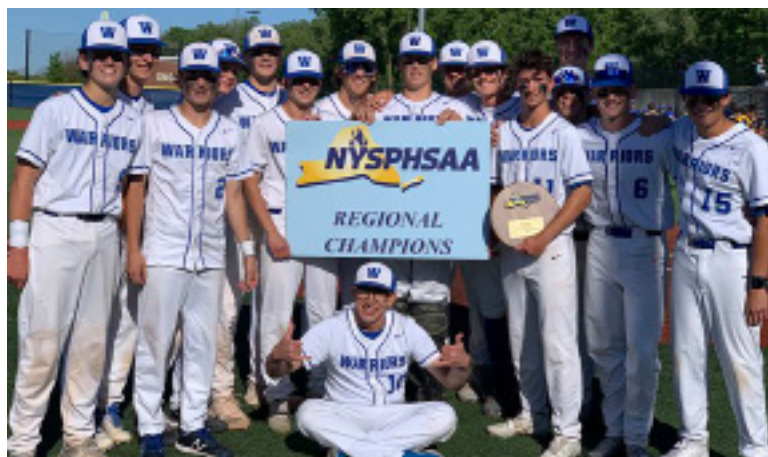
Girls' Track and Field – OHSL League Champions, Section III “Class B1” Champions

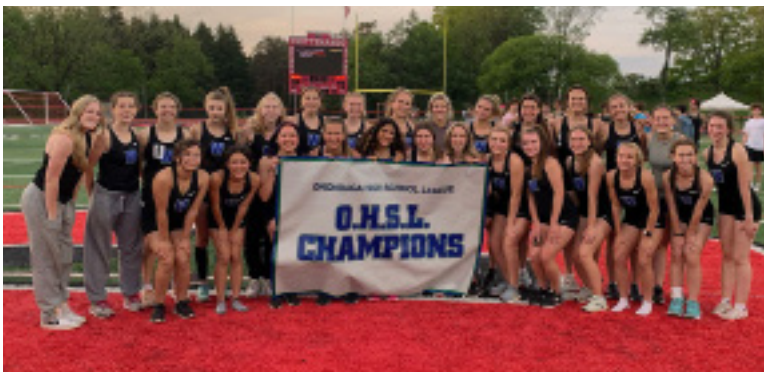

## Bottle and Can Drive for Ukraine

After returning from February break, Mrs. Hathaway's and Mrs. DuBois's homeroom students wanted to learn about the war in Ukraine. After discussions about the complexity of this war, the uncertainty of what would happen next and the inspirational resolve of the Ukrainians to defend themselves, the class wanted to be able to do something to help.

Inspired by our Assistant Principal, Mrs. Ta, who recently raised money for humanitarian aid in Ukraine, the class wanted to do the same. As a result, they decided to collect returnable bottles and cans over the course of a week and donate all of the money collected to a charity that benefited the people of Ukraine. During our bottle and can collection week, our students worked hard after school each day to collect bottles and cans from locations throughout the school building, which included many afternoons of sorting through garbage bags. Additionally, many families donated bags of bottles and cans, which were collected on the final day.



As a result of our students' hard work, we were able to return 6,452 bottles and cans. In addition to some monetary donations, our donation total came to \$605.26. After collecting this money, the students researched different charities and then selected the one that we believed best benefitted the Ukrainian people. As a result, our money will be donated to Sunflower of Peace, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that works to provide medical and humanitarian aid for paramedics and doctors in the areas that are affected by the violence in Ukraine. With the money that we donate, they will acquire and distribute first-aid backpacks, medicine, and medical instruments.

We are extremely proud of and thankful for all of the students, families and staff members who helped make this possible! The concern and generosity our students have shown is to be admired!
